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Electrical Re-Wiring and Upgrade

In June, the school had some fantastic news! We had secured some funding for major electrical works. The school wiring and boards date back to when the school was built in the late 1950s. As the school has expanded, we need more electrical capacity. So, the demand, along with the out-of-date equipment meant the school is desperately in need of an upgrade.

To facilitate this, we have a plan phased over the next two years. The preparation for the first phase has begun with ceilings being removed on the ground floor. Due to the scale of the project, contractors will be on site during the school day to carry out some of the work, as well as working late after school has finished and on weekends. The contractors have been working hard to minimise disruption to lessons.

The first phase will run until March 2025 and, if funding for the second phase is secured, phase two will then start and run until 2026.

During this exciting time, it is of course vitally important pupils remain safe. The contractors have been briefed about times when pupils will be moving along corridors. However, we are relying on pupils to continue to act in a mature and respectful manner at all times to ensure the safety of all people on our site.

A massive thank you has to go to Mrs Whitehouse, Mr Uddin, Miss Carter and Mr Hayward for their hard work. Firstly, they secured the funding and now they are involved in the planning of the works to ensure it goes smoothly. In addition, we are grateful for their flexibility during weekends to allow contractors to perform the noisiest and most disruptive work when pupils are not on site. **By Mr Holder**


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
Red Wednesday Tasks

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National Justice Museum Trip – Year 10

On Friday 22 November Ms Levine, Mr Lysaght, Mr Hussain, Mr Mull and I accompanied the Year 10 Historians to The National Justice Museum in Nottingham. Pupils took part in a variety of activities and went on a tour of the museum. The day involved acting out a Mock trial based on a real case linked to social media and cyber bullying. As part of the mock trial pupils took a variety of roles including judge, defence barristers, solicitors, jurors, and witnesses. A huge thanks to Mr Hussain for cross examining the witnesses and inspiring the Year 10 Historians to take their roles seriously. A future prosecutor in the making! This was a great opportunity for pupils to explore how their GCSE History studies link to a variety of future careers in Law.

Pupils also had the chance to go on a tour of the museum, learning about how crime and punishment in Britain has changed throughout time. Pupils were able to look at different historical items such as a pillory, scold's bridle and ducking stool. They also visited the dungeons in which many prisoners would have been kept.
