Well done to all pupils for being attentive during this live stream and for taking the time to think about what they can do as we journey through this Jubilee Year.






Holocaust Memorial Week



Building Connection with Your Teen

Even as they grow older, teenagers still need a secure base to return to—a foundation of love and support from their parents or carers. Though your teen might act like they don't need you, your presence remains essential. You are the mirror through which they see themselves, and your words and actions have a big impact on their self-image.

Teens face challenges and pressures we may not have experienced at their age. Staying connected with them helps you remain a supportive influence as they explore who they are and shape their identity.

Understanding the Challenges of Parenting Teens

Parenting a teenager is different from parenting a young child. Teens require space to grow and develop independence, which can feel unfamiliar and sometimes challenging for parents.

Supporting Safe Risk-Taking

Risk-taking is a natural part of teenage development. While it can be tough to watch and may feel counter to your protective instincts, it's important to guide them toward safer ways to explore. Trying to shut down this part of their growth can harm your relationship and may not stop the behaviour.

Peers' Influence

As your teen grows, they may place more value on their friends' opinions than yours, which can feel painful. Their focus on fitting in with peers is normal, though it might make it seem like you're no longer needed. Rest assured, your influence is still there, even if it's not always visible.

Coping with Anxiety

Teenagers often feel overwhelmed by anxiety. This might show up as avoidance, irritability, or even anger especially directed at you, the person they feel safest with. It's hard not to take it personally but remembering that their behaviour often stems from fear or stress can help you respond with patience and understanding.

Independence and Identity

As teens explore their identity, they naturally begin to separate from their family. This doesn't mean they don't need you anymore—they still rely on the structure, love, and support you provide. Helping your teen navigate this journey requires a balance: giving them room to grow while staying close enough to guide and support them when they need it.

Parenting through the teenage years isn't easy, but with understanding and connection, you can help your teen grow into a confident and independent young adult.
