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Message from Chair of Governors



So long, farewell

This is my last report of the term and indeed for 2024. It is also my final one as it is with a heavy heart that I am standing down as a governor at Saint John Wall School.

Having retired from teaching a decade ago I was happy to become a governor at a time when the school was experiencing difficulties. Mr Quinn arrived soon after as Executive Principal accompanied as Head of School by Miss Marston. Many years ago, at the start of his Presidency, JFK said leaders "choose to do things, not because they are easy but because they are hard." Mr Quinn and Miss Marston together set about making the necessary changes that with the co-operation of our staff and pupils have transformed the school. It has gone on to enjoy its most successful period since being established.

It makes very impressive reading and was a similar story last year and the year before that for year-on-year the school continues to excel. Achieving success, however, is one thing sustaining it despite the challenges presented by government interference, financial constraints, staff recruitment and safeguarding not to mention the on-going impact of the COVID pandemic underlines what a remarkable record this is. Many congratulations of course go to our pupils on their astonishing achievements. A huge debt of gratitude is owed to our wonderful staff, past and present, and the support from the children's parents.

Education is not solely about exam results, however. With all that it does the school continues to bring Jesus Christ closer to the lives of the young people it serves. You'll have seen for yourselves the many and varied activities that take place in the daily life of the school as shown by the excellent Friday Newsletter issued each week on our superb website.

Six years ago in my first of these articles I wrote: "what a privilege it is to be chair of governors at Saint John Wall School." It has been and I wish to thank all the governors I've worked alongside who have selflessly given of their time and expertise in holding the school to account.

I must mention Mrs Pawar who has been our clerk. Not only has she ensured that as a governing body we have acted legally in fulfilling our responsibilities but has shown enormous patience and wisdom in guiding us though some choppy waters. Also grateful thanks to those members of staff who have attended evening meetings over the years to present countless items keeping governors informed of crucial developments in school and the impact they've had. There are too many individuals to name but they know who they are.

Finally, Miss Marston! Even before being appointed as headteacher over five years ago, I'd witnessed at close hand her professionalism and attention to detail. They tell only half the story however. Our most recent Ofsted report stated that: "The school is led with grace, determination and vision." I've often seen determination and vision mentioned in reports by Ofsted as they are vital qualities for any successful school leader. I have never seen the word "grace" mentioned before. Miss Marston is too modest to dwell on such a description but for me and all those who know her she embodies true Catholic leadership.

So that's it. As Earl Grant once sang: "at the end of a river, the water stops its flow". I wish yourselves and your families a joyful and peaceful Christmas and a Happy New Year and finish, for the last time, with this prayer:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you for the many ways you have blessed us this Christmas. We are grateful for each of those who will gather around our table on Christmas Day. We ask you to bless us and our food and to bless those we love who will not be with us on your Special Day. In our gratitude and love, we remember your humble birth into our lives and pray for those who are without enough to eat. We remember the stable in which you were born and pray for those who have no place to live. We remember your challenging message of caring and giving and we pray for peace in families and nations throughout the world. We bless you and give you thanks in your Spirit who brings our hearts to life this Christmas Day and forever. Amen.


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Kenelm Youth Trust

'On the move' - An opportunity to reflect and learn about the experiences of people seeking sanctuary in our country. It is more important than ever to raise our voices and put our faith into action.


'Bridge building' - An exploration of teamwork and team roles and the importance Christ plays in this.


'I belong' - An arts and crafts session delving into our unique identity in Christ and our place in the world.

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


Christmas Showcase

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Interventions

We are thrilled to see such positive outcomes from our SEND support sessions this term. Attendance has been strong across a range of interventions, each designed to target specific needs: personalised reading sessions, structured literacy programmes, and group-based reading discussions. These interventions not only help improve reading skills and phonics but also build confidence, social interaction, and communication skills. See below some of the interventions we have and what impact they have.

Lexia Form Time

A structured literacy programme focusing on phonics, word recognition, and reading comprehension, helping to build fundamental reading skills.

Dyslexia Gold Form Time

Specialist support for students with dyslexia, enhancing reading, spelling, and memory skills through tailored activities.

Reciprocal Reading

Group reading sessions that promote discussion, critical thinking, and comprehension through peer interaction and guided strategies

Language for Behaviour and Emotion

Sessions designed to improve communication skills and emotional regulation, supporting students in expressing themselves positively.

Midpoint assessments show that regular attendance leads to noticeable progress, with students making gains in literacy, behaviour, and emotional regulation. The enthusiasm and dedication of our students have been inspiring, and it's wonderful to see their hard work paying off.

Thank you to all the staff and students for their commitment to these sessions. Let's continue this excellent progress as we move forward!

Winter infections in children – guidance for parents/guardians

This leaflet gives advice on illnesses that are currently affecting nursery and primary school children across the West Midlands

What are the symptoms?

There are two groups of symptoms:

- Diarrhoea and vomiting usually lasting 1-2 days
- Fever, tiredness, runny nose, cough and sore throat – lasting 3-4 days

What should I do if my child is unwell?

- If your child has diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms, they should not attend nursery/school until they have been symptom free for 48 hours
- If your child has a high temperature and is unwell, it is very important they stay at home and don't attend school until they have recovered. Children with mild symptoms like runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend school.
- Ensure they drink plenty of fluids taking sips rather than gulps, to avoid vomiting
- If they have a fever give child paracetamol and/or ibuprofen, according to manufacturer's instructions. Your pharmacist can also advise you about the best treatment for your child
- If your child is unusually sleepy, can't take fluids or has other symptoms, such as an unusual rash, headache or neck stiffness –

seek medical advice immediately

Infection control advice

Handwashing is one of the most important ways to prevent the spread of both of these infections. This applies to the child who is ill and the person caring for them. Hands should be washed using soap and rinsed under running water:

- Before and after caring for the child
- After using the toilet
- Before eating, preparing or handling food
- After cleaning up spills (vomit, diarrhoea or urine)
- Also keep a separate towel for each family member who has symptoms, and change them regularly
- Dry hands thoroughly

Other control measures:

- Cover nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, using a tissue if possible – dispose of used tissues immediately and wash hands
- Wash soiled clothing, bed linen and towels at 60°C, using detergent – if possible, wear disposable gloves to handle contaminated items
- Surfaces and touch points (taps, toilet flush handle, door handles) should be cleaned then disinfected with bleach-based cleaner
- Check that your child is up to date with their
 <u>NHS vaccinations schedule</u>

Are you to up to date with your vaccines?

This winter, vaccinations are being offered free of charge to those most at risk of getting seriously ill from the flu and/or Covid-19.

NOTE: If you are not eligible for the free flu vaccine, you can still get vaccinated. Please contact your local pharmacy directly for more information and be aware that there will most likely be a cost associated with this.

Do you know how to stay safe from the winter vomiting bug?

Norovirus, also called the "winter vomiting bug", is a stomach bug that causes vomiting and diarrhoea. It can be very unpleasant, but usually goes away in about 2 days.

To protect yourself and your loved ones from Norovirus this winter, make sure to

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water. Alcohol hand gels do not kill norovirus!
- Stay off school or work until you have not been sick for 2 days
- Rest and have lots of fluids to avoid dehydration
